

Training Guide: Crafting Effective Talking Points for Florida Cannabis Action Network Ambassadors

Objective:

This guide is designed to empower volunteer ambassadors of the Florida Cannabis Action Network (FCAN) to create persuasive, concise, and informed talking points for advocating for cannabis legislation in Florida. Ambassadors will learn how to effectively communicate the benefits of cannabis legalization while advocating for change at the grassroots level.

1. What Are Talking Points?

Talking points are short, impactful messages that convey your position on cannabis legalization clearly and persuasively. As an FCAN ambassador, you will use these points to engage lawmakers, media, and the general public in conversations about cannabis reform in Florida.

3. How to Create Effective Talking Points for Pro-Cannabis Legislation:

- **Public Safety:** Data showing how regulated cannabis markets help reduce black-market activity and improve consumer safety.

Step 5: Identify Key Talking Points

Step 6: Address Counterarguments

Anticipate common counterarguments and prepare responses that are based on evidence and facts.

Counterarguments and Responses:

- **"Cannabis is dangerous and will increase crime."**
Response: "States that have legalized cannabis have seen a decrease in cannabis-related crime. Legalization ensures regulated, safe access to cannabis, which reduces black-market activities."
- **"Cannabis is a gateway drug."**

Incorporate **personal stories** where appropriate:

Use Plain Language:

Stay on Message:

It's easy for conversations to stray off-topic. Be polite, but gently guide the conversation back to the core message and your main talking points.

Engage with Your Community:

As an ambassador, your role is also to build community support. Use your talking points to educate and inspire others to get involved—whether through signing petitions, attending rallies, or contacting lawmakers.

Encourage Action:

At the end of every conversation, make sure to ask your audience to take action. This could be calling a legislator, signing a petition, or donating to FCAN.
